The election of our Committee for 2016/17 will take place at the AGM and in this Newsletter there are 4 separate coloured sheets which give the following details relating to the election of posts on our Executive Committee:

If any member is interested in coming to a Committee meeting as an observer, we would be pleased to welcome you. We can only accommodate 2 members at any one meeting. Just contact me and we can arrange it.

The Membership Application Renewal Form is also with the Newsletter and I am pleased to report that the Annual Subscription will remain the same for the fourth consecutive year, i.e. £18 p.a.

We are, however, amending the Branch Policy for Groups and Meetings to reflect that wherever possible all Groups should be financially self-sufficient. If an Interest Group is, for whatever reason, unable to meet in a Member's house, we are bringing in a new way of covering the cost of outside accommodation. On the following page you will see the amended Branch Policy for Groups & Meetings, effective 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2016 and the Charges for Hiring Room/Halls is outlined in Paragraph No 9. I have talked to all the Group Leaders of current Groups who do not meet in members' homes and they are fully in agreement with this change. This will bring parity for Groups who do not meet in a Group Leader's or Host's home.

Two of our members came forward as a result of our request in the last Newsletter to be representatives for Sutton U3A at the U3A London Region Quarterly Meetings - thank you very much Doris Richards and Elizabeth Aumer.

We have renewed our Group Membership of Sutton Seniors Forum for the coming year and therefore Sutton U3A members can attend any of Sutton Seniors Forum Meetings. #### SUTTON U3A - BRANCH POLICY - Effective 1st APRIL 2016

#### **GROUPS & MEETINGS**

- 1. GROUP LEADERS are required to ensure that all persons attending their Group have current Membership Cards by checking them all before or at the latest in May each year, and also checking when a new person joins the Group.
- 2. Members are required to always inform their GROUP LEADER if they are unable to go to a Group Meeting if a Member has been absent for 3 meetings with the GROUP LEADER not being contacted and a reason given from them for their non-attendance, then that Member is assumed to have left the Group.
- 3. GROUP LEADERS are required to keep a waiting list of Members for their Group they should also contact the Groups Co-ordinator when four persons are on the Waiting List in order for an Article to be put in the next Newsletter to seek someone to start a new Group.
- 4. GUESTS may attend ONE Meeting of ONE interest Group before becoming a Member of Sutton U3A.
- 5. GUESTS may attend an Outing by Coach ONCE PER CALENDAR YEAR if there are spaces not required by Members.
- 6. GROUPS a Member can only belong to ONE Group on a Topic. A Leader can be both a Member of a Group and lead another Group on the same topic.
- 7. GENERAL MEETINGS a Guest may attend ONE General Meeting before becoming a Member.
- 8. GROUP MEETINGS Members will contribute 50p (or whatever sum the Group Leader thinks is reasonable) per Meeting at the Group Leader's House to cover expenses.
- 9. GROUP MEETINGS Charges for Hiring Rooms/Small Halls

If an Interest Group is unable to meet in a Member's house, then prior to the beginning of each season (April to August; September to December; January to March) the Leader must contact either the Groups' Co-ordinator or the Chairman to book a suitable room for the Group. When the cost of the booked room for each season is known the Group Leader will be notified and the cost divided between the number of members in the Group. This money, which should be in cheque form, being collected by the Group Leader at the beginning of each season. The Group Leader will then pass the money over to the Treasurer within two weeks of the beginning of each season. There will be no refund for non-attendance at any Group Meetings. Note: Every endeavour will be made to hire a Room at the Civic Centre where the cost is very reasonable; however if there is no availability a booking may have to be made at either Trinity Church or Granfers (these rooms are dearer than Civic Centre).

- 10. GROUP MEETINGS SCIENCE GROUPS Special arrangements apply as the cost of these meetings is shared with Banstead U3A and Epsom & Ewell U3A.
- 11. SOCIAL BRIDGE Special arrangements apply for Social Bridge at Granfers.
- 12. ART GROUPS Special arrangements apply. Members of an Art Group will pay £50 per year (April to March) in addition to the annual subscription of £18; if a member attends a second Art Group, then a further £50 per year is payable. The Group Leaders are responsible for collecting the appropriate amount of money in cheque form per season and passing the money over to the Treasurer within two weeks of the beginning of each season. There will be no refund for non-attendance at any Art Meetings.

So come and join us!



## Social Club Guidelines

All outings include coach hire, a tip for the driver and entrance fee – we are non-profit making! With fluctuating fuel prices we always compare coach prices, but please be assured we always negotiate the most advantageous price for Sutton U3A members.

 Bookings. These must be made using the application form, plus cheque to secure a place, either by post (plus SAE) to the organiser or in person at a General Meeting. Verbal requests do not secure a confirmed place.

A STAMPED ADDRESSED ENVELOPE must be enclosed when booking by post in order that a receipt can be sent which confirms a place on the outing.

An **EMERGENCY CONTACT** is requested as, without this, the organiser would not know how or who to inform should a member have an accident or be taken ill, especially if they were unable to travel home on the coach. We hope this shows an assurance of care, and is not perceived as intrusive. All applications are treated as confidential and are destroyed after the outing or theatre trip.

The organiser of each outing will keep a WAITING LIST.

- Payment by cheque only please!
   One cheque for EACH outing or theatre trip.
   Each event has its own organiser and funding etc.
- 3. **Guests** Members are welcome to invite their non-U3A spouse or a friend, on ONE outing or theatre trip per year.
- 4. Cancellations of Bookings for outings and theatre trips. In the case of hospital admissions and/or appointments at short notice.
- 5. We ENDEAVOUR to make a refund ONLY IF the place can be filled from the waiting list.

  NB. NO REFUND will be made to anyone failing to turn up —or does not turn up by the PICK UP time stipulated on the day.



## Visit to Canterbury 25th November, 2015
