# MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of SUTTON U3A HELD AT TRINITY CHURCH HALL, SUTTON ON FRIDAY 29<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2015

### WELCOME

On behalf of Audrey Willson, Derek Yeo chaired the meeting and welcomed everyone to the AGM, especially any new members present.

Apologies received from Audrey Willson, Maggs Sandilands and Cheryl Bailey.

### MINUTES OF LAST AGM HELD ON 30<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2014

There were no matters arising and these were approved unanimously.

### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

Audrey Willson's report was circulated in the Spring Newsletter 2015.

It had been a very interesting and busy year, due in the main because of a more proactive approach taken to publicising Sutton U3A and its activities.

During the past 12 months membership grew to 361, with six new Groups starting – Theatre Group B, Trollope, Cinema Streaming, Town & Country, Play Reading and a Piano Group - great news for Sutton U3A as Groups are the lifeblood of any U3A.

Our first Open Afternoon at Civic Centre was a great success, as was the Cheam Charter Fair earlier this month. This summer we will again have a stall at the Carshalton Environmental Fair and SCOLA's Big Event.

Audrey thanked the Executive Committee and Social Committee for all their hard work, as well as Group Leaders and Hosts for running all the Groups so efficiently.

Derek thanked Audrey for the tremendous amount of work she had done over the past year, including the re-establishment of liaison with other neighbouring U3As.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

Copies of the accounts for the 12 months ended 31st March 2015 were circulated at the meeting.

These show a deficit of £1,439 in receipts and payments, compared with a surplus of £494 during the previous year. The deficit was almost entirely accounted for by extra publicity related payments, as the Committee felt that publicity should be a priority, to avert declining membership.

£960 was spent on new equipment (almost all publicity related), consisting of a gazebo, folding chairs, a folding table, an upright stand and various name banners. These items were one-off and accordingly should not be repeated in the current year's accounts. Additionally, some £447 related to ongoing publicity charges (i.e. event charges and advertising). However almost half of ongoing publicity costs were covered by a grant of £190 received from the Third Age Trust.

Subs and pre-subs, at £6,188, have remained fairly stable, despite some fall in membership earlier in the year.

Although the rise in hall hire contributions exceeded the rise in payments for hall hire, overall hall hire payments were considerably in excess of contributions. However, the contributions excluded the practical art groups, which pay towards hall hire by way of an enhanced subscription. Additionally, part of the hall payments are for general meetings, costing just over £200 a year. Payments also included an advance payment of £160 towards hall hire by one of the art groups.

Other factors contributing towards this year's deficit have been rises in costs of printing, postage and stationery. Part of the extra printing cost resulted from publicity related material, but also extra circulars about changes in our Constitution and a Special Meeting to vote for these changes. Some part of the extra postage and stationery costs were also as a result of these extra circulars.

It was emphasised that members who take the newsletters by email save the U3A a considerable amount, with postage costing around £4 a year for members receiving the newsletter by post, and additional expenses for printing and stationery.

Turning to the balance sheet, reserves are fully adequate, at £10,872. These reserves consist of cash, bank account, and reserves with COIF, a body recommended for holding spare reserves of charities. The reduction in total reserves reflects the deficit for the year, as explained above. No increase in Subscription levels has been made for the current year.

Acceptance of the Accounts was agreed unanimously, proposed by David Muir and seconded by Liz Robson. Thanks were expressed to Geoff Haseler, who has examined and signed off the Accounts for a second year.

Bill Brewer was not standing for re-election, having been Treasurer for the past 3 years. He wished Sutton U3A a successful and solvent future.

#### **APPOINTMENT OF EXAMINER**

The AGM endorsed the appointment of Geoff Haseler as Examiner for the following year, proposed by Margaret Laurence and seconded by Patricia Le Serve.

#### MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mavis McCarthy reported that membership as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2015 stood at 361 members, with 80 new members and 19 formal resignations. Although the majority of members have renewed, a reminder has been sent to those outstanding and these are now coming in.

Mavis reported the death of the following five members:-

Pauline Campion Victor Jordan Chris Pocock Gwen Tredgett Barbara Isaac Coffee mornings for new members have been held successfully every two months, which has helped to introduce members to each other and learn more about the Sutton Branch. The next one will be at 10.30am on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> July at the Oasis Coffee Shop.

### **SOCIAL COMMITTEE REPORT**

On behalf of Maggs Sandilands, Mavis McCarthy reported that over the past year the Social Committee have arranged five summer outings, four theatre trips, a January quiz and a special guided walk. Despite losses of £177 on two of the outings, overall there was a small gain of £57.62. The decision to give Sutton members a priority booking period before offering places to neighbouring U3As has boosted participation in our activities.

The programme for 2014-15 included:

- The Henry Moore Foundation
- January Quiz at the Salvation Army hall
- Guided Walk around the Inns of Court in London and lunch at Middle Temple Hall
- Theatre trips to The Pyjama Game, Miss Saigon, Anything Goes and Shakespeare in Love

Thanks were given to the individual Social Committee members who organised these.

In addition, the Guided Art Gallery Tours with Ann Davies have become increasingly popular and well supported.

On behalf of Maggs, Mavis thanked members of the Social Committee for their hard work over the past year, as well as Mary Gates who assists on an ad hoc basis, and welcomed Brenda Pennington to the Committee. Thanks were given to Carol Stevens and Audrey Willson and the Committee are sad to lose their input.

#### **ANY OTHER BUSINESS**

Brenda Dombey asked members who are tax payers to complete and return the forms for Gift Aid.

It was suggested that postage might be saved by folding Newsletters and sending out in A5 envelopes rather than A4. [Post meeting note – this has been investigated and is no cheaper because of the weight involved.]

Derek Yeo thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and introduced Ian McCannah, Regional Trustee.

### SUTTON U3A - BRANCH POLICY - Effective 1st APRIL 2016

**Revised 1 February 2016** 

### **GROUPS & MEETINGS**

<u>GROUP LEADERS</u> are required to ensure that all persons attending their Group have current Membership Cards by checking them all before or at the latest in May each year, and also checking when a new person joins the Group

Members are required to <u>always</u> inform their <u>GROUP LEADER</u> if they are unable to go to a Group Meeting – if a Member has been absent for 3 meetings with the <u>GROUP LEADER</u> not being contacted and a reason given from them for their non-attendance, then that Member is assumed to have left the Group.

<u>GROUP LEADERS</u> are required to keep a waiting list of Members for their Group – they should also contact the Groups Co-ordinator when four persons are on the Waiting List in order for an Article to be put in the next Newsletter to seek someone to start a new Group

GUESTS may attend ONE Meeting of ONE interest Group before becoming a Member of Sutton U3A

<u>GUESTS</u> may attend an Outing by Coach <u>ONCE PER CALENDAR YEAR</u> if there are spaces not required by Members

<u>GROUPS</u> – a Member can only belong to <u>ONE</u> Group on a Topic. A Leader can be both a Member of a Group and lead another Group on the same topic

<u>GENERAL MEETINGS</u> – a Guest may attend <u>ONE</u> General Meeting before becoming a Member.

<u>GROUP MEETINGS</u> - Members will contribute 50p (or whatever sum the Group Leader thinks is reasonable) per Meeting at the Group Leader's House to cover expenses

GROUP MEETINGS - Charges for Hiring Rooms/Small Halls

If an Interest Group is unable to meet in a Member's house, then prior to the beginning of each season (April to August; September to December; January to March) the Leader must contact either the Groups' Co-ordinator or the Chairman to book a suitable room for the Group. When the cost of the booked room for each season is known the Group Leader will be notified and the cost divided between the number of members in the Group. This money, which should be in cheque form, being collected by the Group Leader at the beginning of each season. The Group Leader will then pass the money over to the Treasurer within two weeks of the beginning of each season. There will be no refund for non attendance at any Group Meetings. Note: Every endeavour will be made to hire a Room at the Civic Centre where the cost is very reasonable; however if there is no availability a booking may have to be made at either Trinity Church or Granfers (these rooms are dearer than Civic Centre).

<u>GROUP MEETINGS – SCIENCE GROUPS</u> - Special arrangements apply as the cost of these meetings is shared with Banstead U3A and Epsom & Ewell U3A

SOCIAL BRIDGE - Special arrangements apply for Social Bridge at Granfers

<u>ART GROUPS</u> - Special arrangements apply. Members will pay £30 for 2016/17 in addition to their £18 annual subscription; if a member attends a second Art Group then a further £30 is payable. Group leaders are responsible for collecting and ensuring all their members pay the appropriate sum - either £10 at the start of each season (April to August; September to December; January to March). or £30 in one go; these amounts to be sent to the Treasurer in cheque form early in each season. There will be no refund for non-attendance at any of the Art meetings.

On Friday 19th February Margaret Stevens, Don Jordan and George Sage showed their photographs of Monet's Giverny Garden alongside Monet's paintings of the same subject.

For a couple of hours the winter weather was banished from our minds while we enjoyed looking at the gorgeous images projected simultaneously and enlarged onto the walls of the hall in the Sutton Life Centre.

Ann Davies offered a commentary on Monet's paintings while Margaret, Don and George made the garden real by describing their visits to Giverny and locating their photographs within the garden to give the audience a sense of its geography and atmosphere. George, Don and Margaret had visited the gardens separately during different months in 2004, 2008 and 2013 respectively.

The presentation began with their photographs of the iconic Japanese bridge alongside a Monet painting of the same scene. From the outset it was apparent that the garden had inspired the three photographers to compose and capture the effects of light that so beguiled Monet.

A series of different views followed which guided us around the garden and towards the house. There was one cheeky photograph taken by Margaret from within the house.

Photography within the house is forbidden but we are grateful to Margaret for her daring effort!

It was interesting to see how little the garden had changed since Monet's time (he died in 1926), although there had been alterations to the planting scheme. This led to a lively discussion on the merits of modern planting and whether it was true to Monet's vision.

### Town and Country Group at the BBC

### Wednesday 24th February

On a cold February morning a group of 21 members gathered outside the Media Café in the precinct of BBC House in London. We were told in advance that strict security arrangements were in place and it took the whole party 20 minutes to be finally vetted as "safe to enter the portals of the BBC"!

We thus stepped inside the exciting world of broadcasting at Portland Place, London to look behind the scenes of the dynamic live broadcasting hub and to find out what goes on at the beating heart of the BBC. The two Guides, Adrian and Jan, were introduced to us and Jan first explained about the rich history of the building and the BBC and, from the Observation Gallery, we were all able to view the state of the art newsroom where all the world news is streamed in continuously, then vetted and put forward for various television and radio new studios. We also saw from a distance the current weather programme being transmitted.

Adrian then took over guiding our group and took us into an adjoining building to show us the Studio which is home to The One Show.



He explained how the nightly topical magazine programme is put together and we all sat on the famous sofa where many favourite celebrities and personalities have sat and been interviewed by Matt, Alex and Chris. The Studio looks onto the entrance to the new BBC building at street level.

We then went into the original BBC building and went into a Studio where a couple of members had a go at reading the news, and one did the weather forecasting. In another Studio we saw where BBC Radio Drama is made – members were asked if they would like to have a go at recording our own radio



play, and a few brave members went ahead and read a short play from scripts provided, with Jan and Adrian applying music and realistic sound effects!


Then the tour was over and we all returned to the new BBC building and bade farewell to Adrian and Jan who were very entertaining and informative Guides.

Take a peep into the original gardening sheds and into the main gardens surrounding the original 'stately home' (now West Dean Training College) and walk the length of the 300 foot pergola covered with roses, honeysuckle and clematis.

Take a picnic lunch or visit the Garden Restaurant for a hot, homemade meal or snack. Visit the quirky shop, which also has plants for sale.



After lunch we go on to **Bignor Roman Villa**, one of the largest ever found, discovered in 1871 by a local farmer. There is an introductory talk, after which we can explore the site with its well preserved mosaics. Before leaving, we will have a Sussex Cream Tea!






