Christopher Pocock May 1958 – January 2015

Chris was a man of many facets. He was a very active member of Carshalton Methodist Church in Ruskin Road, Carshalton. He regularly led Sunday prayers informed by an excellent comprehension of local affairs and world news. His research on local church history formed the backbone of the church's centenary celebrations just a few years ago.

He was also an active supporter of the Liberal Democrat Party — he had joined the Young Liberals when he was a student, together with Derek Yeo's daughter. As many of us know, Chris's great passion was genealogy research, becoming expert in this field. He joined the East Surrey Family History Society in 2004 and became the Sutton Group Secretary and was responsible for booking the speakers for their monthly meetings.

Chris joined Sutton U3A in 2004 following a talk given by Margaret Storey at his church. He immediately became active in our organisation and started a Family History Group and later led the monthly Discussion Group as well as becoming Deputy Chair of the Executive Committee. He also represented Sutton U3A at Regional level and until recently he edited our newsletter.

Chris was the prime carer for his younger brother, Keith, who has both mental health and physical health issues. Chris visited him twice a week at his residential care home in Epsom and managed his financial affairs. Chris also leaves his former wife, Beryl, a daughter, Linda, and two sons, Alan and Gary

Although being a diabetic, he enjoyed meeting his pals at the local pubs for a chat several times a week, but he only ever drank diet cola. His tragic early death at the age of 56 is a sad loss; Chris was a character you could not ignore because of the zeal he displayed for whatever he undertook.

He will be very much missed.
